Why we do this

Training software is hard to evaluate from a marketing page. Someone has to actually take the course, and a team has to see whether it changes how they work. Sixty days and fifteen seats is enough to find out. If it doesn't land, you have lost nothing but the time you chose to spend.

What the team lead gets

A dashboard with live visibility across the whole evaluation:

- Seats redeemed, and how many are still unused
- Every student by name, with the date they registered and the date they were last active
- Where each person stands: not started, in progress, or complete
- Percent complete per person, and how many of the team finished the course
- The whole table as a CSV, if you would rather work in a spreadsheet

You will know in week one whether people are actually engaging, not at the end.

At the 60-day mark we send a written summary: seats used, completion rates, and where the team ended up. It is suitable for training records or for justifying a budget request.

What each student gets

- Full course access for the evaluation term
- Complete video transcripts and closed captions
- All source code via public GitHub repositories
- Progress tracking that follows them across the web and the mobile apps
- A Talk Python completion certificate, which they can add to LinkedIn in one click under licenses and certifications

Minimum team size	5 people
Delivery	Hosted web platform. Nothing to install, no access to your network or systems required.
Data stored	Student name, email address, and course progress. Nothing else. Students may use personal email addresses. Records deleted at the end of the evaluation on request.
Accessibility	All course video includes transcripts and closed captions in 4 languages. Our Section 508 accessibility report (VPAT) is published at training.talkpython.fm/static/accessibility/vpat.html
Government and public sector	SAM.gov registered. UEI: LAGGTJXSEH8. W-9 available on request. Team licenses typically fall below the \$15,000 federal micro-purchase threshold, which generally puts them within government purchase card authority.

If you want to continue afterward

Team licenses are not quoted. Courses are \$19 to \$49 per seat at list price and the volume tiers are published: discounts start at the fifth seat and reach 50% of list, and the checkout applies them automatically. You own what you buy permanently, so there is no renewal and nothing expires. Purchase orders and invoices are available if a card does not suit your finance department.
